The SBA's Economic Injury Disaster
Loan program provides small businesses
and nonprofits with working capital
loans of up to \$2 million that can provide
vital economic support to
small businesses and nonprofits to
help overcome the temporary loss of
revenue they are experiencing.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Located in Washington, DC
- Business license is up to date
- At least 25% revenue loss due to COVID-19

BEFORE APPLYING, CORE ITEMS TO PREPARE

- 2017 & 2018 Tax returns (Personal returns accepted if business returns unavailable)
- 2019 Profit & Loss Statement
- Schedule of Liabilities
